"Wondering How Stars are Formed?

The three stages of a star's formation are: Nebula, Protostar and the Main Sequence Star. Did you know a Nebula is the first step. This is what happens to a Nebula. A Nebula is a cloud of gas and dust and the Nebula is trying to separate into smaller clouds of gas and sut but gravity is trying to pull it inwards and eventually gravity wins.

The Protostar is the second stage of the making of a star. It keeps pulling the remains of the Nebula into the centre. After a while the gas and dust starts spinning around the centre of the Protostar, If the gas and dust breaks away you now have a Main Sequence Star, but if the gas and dust does not break away, then it could be the start of a planet.
